Introduction

The Armistice agreement of 1949 divided Jerusalem into East Jerusalem, controlled by Jordan, and West Jerusalem, controlled by Israel¹. Israel immediately passed laws stripping Palestinians who had fled, of their right to return and any land ownership in West Jerusalem. During the 1967 war, Israel gained control of both the West Bank and East Jerusalem². In a move still not legally recognized by the International community, following the end of the war, Israel unilaterally annexed East Jerusalem, and began the ongoing occupation of the West Bank, the Sinai Peninsula and the Gaza Strip.

According to an Israeli survey taken in 1967 there were 197,700 Israelis and 68,000 Palestinians in West & East Jerusalem. In East Jerusalem there were no Israelis living there. Since that time Israel has implemented a series of discriminatory policies and practices aimed at systematically reducing the number of Palestinians living in East Jerusalem in order to maintain a 70% Israeli-30% Palestinian balance³. In total it is estimated that Israel's apartheid like policies targeting Palestinians in East Jerusalem have caused roughly 70,000 Palestinians to change their residence.

In 1993 and 1995, the Oslo Accords were signed between the Palestinian Authority and the Israeli government. The damaging effects of which are still haunting Palestinians today. One particularly detrimental agreement that came from the Oslo accords was the power sharing agreement between the Israeli

government and the Palestinian Authority. Through the Oslo accords, Palestine was divided into three territories; Gaza, the West Bank and East Jerusalem. Then the West Bank was further categorized into three different areas; A, B, C. The Palestinians that live in each of these sections are ruled by different laws and given a different set of rights; East Jerusalem is fully under the control of Israeli Civilian law, area A is fully under the control of the Palestinian Authority, area B is under the Palestinian Authorities civil law but Israel's military law, and finally area C is fully under Israeli military law. Supposedly, according to these divisions, Palestinians living in Jerusalem are given more rights under Israeli law than any other Palestinians. In order to signify this, Palestinians from Jerusalem carry a blue ID, versus the green ID carried by Palestinians from the West Bank.

Palestinians in Jerusalem face daily discrimination, despite their blue ID, on both a personal daily basis and an institutional basis. Israeli has put in place a series of discriminatory laws aimed at making life so difficult for Palestinians that they are ultimately forced to move away from Jerusalem, leaving it to become the "unified capital" of Israel. However, despite all of the discrimination, Palestinians continue resisting through many different means, existence being one of them.



Confiscation of Land

sraeli's confiscation of large swaths of land in East Jerusalem, combined with their policies restricting Palestinians ability to build, have been the most effective means by which they have prevented the East Jerusalem Palestinian community from expanding. In 2002, when Israel began building the wall, they confiscated 19.2% of Palestinian's land in East Jerusalem⁴. Then, through a series of other aggressive tactics, Israel had further decreased the amount of land for Palestinians in East Jerusalem. As of 2013, Palestinians were only allowed to build on 13% of the land in East Jerusalem, most of which is already suffering from severe overcrowding issues⁵. Under the development plan currently in place in East Jerusalem, 35% of the land has been expropriated for settlement construction, 22% has been allocated for Israeli national parks, and 30% remains unplanned and thus is illegal for Palestinians to build on.

Under the National Parks program, the Israeli government has established five parks in East Jerusalem since 1967. As of 2015, three more parks have been in the planning stages. Under Israeli law, once land has been designated as a National Park, no construction is allowed, a convenient method of stealing land that has not been limited to East Jerusalem boundaries. The existing five parks cover 284 hectares of land, and when completed, the three parks currently being planned will cover an additional 137 hectares⁶. Not only do these parks restrict the amount of land Palestinians can build on in East Jerusalem, they also preserve strategic plots of land that connect areas slated for future settlement development, particularly the controversial area known as E1, in East Jerusalem.

E1, a 12,000 dunam area of land between the Israeli settlement of Ma'aleh Adummim and Jerusalem, is currently one of the most disputed and under threat areas of the West Bank, Israel plans to use the area to further expand the industrial section of the Ma'aleh Adummim settlement whilst connecting it directly to greater Jerusalem. In the process of this, a further two settlements would be constructed and East Jerusalem would be completely severed from the West Bank. Moreover, the north of the West Bank would become isolated from the south of the West Bank, rendering them fragmented territories from one another. The E1 area also houses 2,600 Bedouins who have been in residence there since expulsion from the Negev in 1967. Israel plans to permanently displace these families, illegal under international law, instead offering them new areas in which they can supposedly reside, all of which have been deemed wholly unsuitable for a population to live within, including one site located alongside a landfill.



Demo

alestinians in both East Jerusalem and the E1 area are constantly faced with the threat of their homes being demolished. Since the E1 area is technically in area C of the West Bank, all building permits must be approved by the Israeli Authorities; from 2010-2014, only 1.5% of building permits in the whole of area C were approved⁷. Thus, most E1 Bedouins are forced to build without a permit. However, building without a permit puts the builder at high risk of having their homes or structures demolished. In August of 2015, the number of demolitions being carried out by Israel reached a peak of 22 in just one day8. Palestinians in East Jerusalem face similar threats of home demolitions. With only 55% of Palestinian building permit requests approved each year, as compared to 85% of Israeli permit requests. 20,000 Palestinian homes have been constructed without a permit, which means about 90,000 Palestinians are at risk of displacement due to home demolitions. Between 2000-2014 Israel demolished 1,342 buildings displacing 5,760 people in East Jerusalem, and by November 2015, there had already been 450 demolitions this year displacing 513 people, showing the increasing trend for house demolitions. In November of 2015 alone, there were eight demolitions in Jerusalem, which displaced fifteen people9.

These demolitions simply compound the already existent overcrowding problem in the Palestinian neighborhoods of East Jerusalem. Overcrowding in East Jerusalem is becoming a rapidly concerning issue and is not limited to housing; many East

Jerusalem schools have been left in the position whereby they haven't enough space for the number of children their catchment area is meant to cover. It has already been estimated that 81,638 new housing units will be required by 2030. However, with the current 13% of East Jerusalem land on which Palestinians are allowed to build already being over populated, there is no room for these much-needed new housing units. Thus, many of the next generation of East Jerusalem Palestinians will be forced to choose between living in severely overcrowded conditions or leaving Jerusalem forever.

Citizens of nowhere

Palestinians who stop living in Jerusalem, for whatever reason, risk losing their right to live there ever again and thus their right to return to their home city. Despite the fact that many of the East Jerusalem Palestinians come from families who have resided in Jerusalem since before the state of Israel existed, Israel views them as only permanent residents of Jerusalem and not as citizens of the state. This status, the same given to foreigners who settle in Israel, can be taken away at any point. Thus, East Jerusalem Palestinians are citizenship-less. A blue ID, as compared to the green ID of West Bank Palestinians, signifies permanent residency status. If at any point an East Jerusalem Palestinian cannot prove that Jerusalem is the "center of their life" through home ownership, children's school enrollment, etc. they are likely to have their blue ID taken away from them. Once stripped of permanent residency, Palestinians must apply



to the Israeli Authority for a permit to enter Jerusalem, which can be very difficult to obtain, and during times of political or civil turmoil, are regularly withheld as a form of collective punishment. The loss of a blue ID also means a loss of the other benefits that Jerusalem taxpayers are entitled to; such as access to the national health care system and the right to live and work in Jerusalem.

Given the grave consequences that come along with the revocation of an East Jerusalem Palestinian's blue ID, it shouldn't be a common tactic. However, since 1967 Israel has revoked the residency of 14,416 Palestinians¹⁰. The highest number of revocations occurred in 2008, when in just one year Israel stripped 4,577 Palestinians of their basic human right to live in their family homes and ancestral city¹¹.

East Jerusalem Palestinians who marry Palestinians from other areas are the most affected by permanent residency revocations. It is almost impossible at this point to get a blue ID for a spouse. Thus when a Palestinians with a blue ID marries a Palestinians with a green ID, there are really only two options; Either the person with the green ID lives in Jerusalem illegally, or the person with the blue ID leaves Jerusalem with the high likelihood of losing their ID. Children of such marriages only further complicate the matter; a blue ID does not automatically transfer from parents to children. Thus, if one parent has a green ID, especially if the father is the possessor of the green ID, it can be basically impossible for a child to obtain a blue ID.

Social Services, Education, and Health Care

aving a blue ID and living in Jerusalem does entitle East Jerusalem Palestinians to certain services provided by the Jerusalem Municipality. Despite the unequal allocation of services, Palestinians, as residents of Jerusalem, are mandated to pay the same taxes as Israelis. However, the distribution of services between East and West Jerusalem is highly inequitable with only 8.79% of the Municipality budget spent on East Jerusalem Palestinian neighborhoods in 2012.

The lack of resources invested in East Jerusalem is clearly reflected in the education system. East Jerusalem needs roughly 1,000 additional classrooms just to teach all of the Palestinian children¹². However, only 3% of East Jerusalem

land is currently zoned for the construction of public buildings, which clearly fails to meet the actual needs of the Palestinian community. The over crowding of East Jerusalem schools has created a situation in which only 41% of Palestinian students are enrolled in municipality run schools, forcing the rest to pay high tuition fees for private schools. Furthermore, the students who are enrolled in East Jerusalem schools are severely disadvantaged because the Jerusalem municipality spends only 12,000 ILS per East Jerusalem student as compared to the 25,000 ILS it spends per West Jerusalem student¹³. These less than adequate learning environments have resulted in 13% of Palestinian children dropping out of school as compared to 1% of Israeli students¹⁴.

The detrimental effects of Israel's lack of investment in East Jerusalem also stretch to infrastructure. Only 64% of East Jerusalem homes are currently connected to the official municipality water system, leaving the rest of the East Jerusalem home reliant on tankered water, which is considerably more expensive per cubic meter and varies in delivery cost according to how close your home is to the distribution center. Septic tanks have also become increasingly relied on, yet these come with associated health risks due to blockage and overflow without constant care, thus risking the communities' health¹⁵.

Other municipality run services in East Jerusalem versus their counterparts in West Jerusalem also reflect the disgracefully low amount of investment in East Jerusalem. There are only six health care facilities for infants in East Jerusalem, as compared to the 26 in West Jerusalem. Furthermore, there are only nine posts offices, compared to 42 in West Jerusalem. The availability, or lack of availability, of these seemingly mundane services actually has a huge negative effect on Palestinian's lives, and can make basic daily needs become a battle to fulfill.

Not only must East Jerusalemites survive with inadequate services, they must do so while watching Israeli settlers who live in East Jerusalem receive full services. As of 2014, there were almost 300,000 Israeli settlers in East Jerusalem¹⁶, a number not dissimilar to those in the West Bank. Despite the severe overcrowding of East Jerusalem Palestinian neighborhoods, settlers are able to build because roughly 35% of East Jerusalem has been specifically zoned for settler homes¹⁷. In 2014 alone, the Israeli government approved plans for 2,239 new settler units in East Jerusalem¹⁸.

The sheer number of settlers illegally moving to East Jerusalem has caused an upsurge in the human rights abuses Palestinians must suffer on a regular basis. In 2014 alone, there were 80 assaults by settlers on Palestinians and 106 attacks on Palestinian property by settlers¹⁹. Palestinians are abused on a daily basis in Jerusalem, even within their own neighborhoods, and are systematically targeted by the increasingly heavy IOF foot presence within those neighborhoods. Such abuses come in the form of being run over by cars, stabbed, pummeled with stones, escaping attempted kidnappings and all types of verbal abuses²⁰.

However, there were few settlers actually charged for these assaults with the impunity from law enjoyed by West Bank settlers rapidly becoming the status quo within the Jerusalem boundaries. Over 85% of attacks on Palestinians by settlers go unresolved due to failure of the Israeli police to investigate. Yet in 2014, Israeli police arrested 2,250 Palestinians in East Jerusalem, 700 of whom were minors for reasons as mundane as stone throwing or simply being in the wrong location. Israel has arrested children as young as seven and issued warrants for children as young as two. Sadly, 55% of East Jerusalem children arrested by Israeli police are physically abused during the arrest and/or detainment, and once finally released, endure the hardships of the psychological effects that come from such treatment with no offer or rehabilitation or counseling from state provided services.

Thus, Palestinians are forced to face daily abuse for living where their ancestors have lived for generations and sadly, they must do so with no hope of justice for the perpetrators of the abuses.

of East Jerusalem

Not only do East Jerusalem Palestinians have to live with inferior infrastructure and human rights abuses on a daily basis, they must always find a way to survive in what has become a suffocated economy. Under international law, Israel, as an occupying power, has a duty to ensure that the Palestinian citizens of East Jerusalem are not unfairly disadvantaged by the occupation. However, Israel's discriminatory policies have been deliberately designed to ensure the eventual demise of the East Jerusalem economy.

Prior to Israel's building of the wall, Palestinians from across the West Bank would come to shop in Jerusalem. Now, however due to the permit system, Israel prevents most West Bank Palestinians from entering Jerusalem. It is estimated that the Israeli wall has cost the East Jerusalem economy \$1 billion, or \$200 million each year since its construction²¹. With most of East Jerusalem's previous businesses being redirected to areas

that are now on the West Bank side of the wall²², demonstrated by these areas outside of the wall having seen a 50% increase in their number of customers²³.

The affect of this significant drop in customers has obviously affected the business climate in East Jerusalem. Thus, due to the exclusionary effect of the wall over 5,000 East Jerusalem businesses have been forced to shut down²⁴. Which, in turn, has severely affected the job market in East Jerusalem.

The isolating and suffocating effects of the wall have caused detrimentally high unemployment with 70% of Jerusalemites aged 15-24 unemployed and only 44.4% of Jerusalemites age 45-55 employed. Of the East Jerusalem Palestinians who are lucky enough to have a job, 80.1% are forced to work as wage employees, most likely in one of the two biggest industries in East Jerusalem; service, 25% of the job market, or education, 19% of the job market²⁵. This is regardless of their education and or skill set.

Further, devastating the already economically disadvantaged Palestinians of East Jerusalem, Israel has placed bans on cheaper goods being imported from the West Bank to East Jerusalem, instead forcing East Jerusalemites to buy more expensive Israeli goods. These bans on cheaper goods have been found to cost the East Jerusalem economy \$48 million²⁶. The combined suffocating effects of the wall have resulted in 75.4% of Palestinians living below the poverty line as compared to 21.8% of Israelis²⁷.

Jerusalemites outside of the wall

Not all Palestinian East Jerusalemites live inside of the wall. Currently, there are 80,000 Palestinian Jerusalemites living in seven communities, which are technically in the jurisdiction of the Jerusalem municipality but have been cut off from the city by the apartheid wall²⁸. These Palestinians hold permanent residency just like Jerusalemites inside the wall. The difference is that they must cross checkpoints in order to access Jerusalem. When the path of the wall was first announced the Israeli government guaranteed that the level of municipality services to the seven communities outside of the wall would not be affected. However, since the construction of the wall, these seven communities have been cut off from all of the services provided by the municipality.

The Israeli police refuse to patrol or enforce any form of law outside of the wall. However, because the seven communities are technically within Jerusalem, the Israelis won't let the Palestinian Authority police patrol there either. Similarly, there are no fire fighters, job centers, or post offices. For all 80,000 people there are only three usable schools. The lack of schools forces 2000 plus students and 250 teachers to cross the wall each day in order to attend, or teach, school. Other infrastructure that should be provided by the municipality such as water pipes, sewage pipes, roads, public transportation, streetlights etc. are all absent outside of the wall, despite the community members paying taxes to the municipality. When these communities need services such as a road paved or a fire department, they must pull together and fundraise amongst themselves.

Of the 80,000 Palestinians living outside of the wall, only 300 homes are officially connected to the water network. This is mainly due to the water company's refusal to send workers to install new water meters. The lack of water connections contribute to the bigger problem of Palestinians outside of the wall consuming 16.5 cubic meters less per capita/per year than the World Health Organization's recommended amount²⁹. The lack of water connections also means that many of these homes are reliant on septic tanks for sewage. Septic tanks have a tendency to overflow and thus, frequently create cesspools within these communities.

The Jerusalemites outside of the wall are consistently blighted by their location. Daily life is extremely difficult, yet, they cannot move to the West Bank, where life is easier, without the risk of losing their blue ID. Thus, Jerusalemites outside of the wall have two viable options, remain in their neighborhoods and make the best of their circumstances, or move to a neighborhood in East Jerusalem that is already extremely crowded and offers limited respite from their situations.


The Old City

While Palestinians living in the Old City do not have the same struggles as those living outside of the wall, life in the Old City does come with its own struggles. There are four quarters in the old city; the Muslim quarter, Jewish quarter, Armenian quarter, and Christian quarter. Previously there was a fifth quarter known as the Maghreb quarter, which was destroyed by the Israelis to make room for the Western Wall plaza.

One of the main and ongoing tensions present in the Old City stems from Israel's constant efforts to expand the Jewish quarter having begun in 1967. Currently, Israel is in the fourth stage of expansion, which is characterized by groups of rich Israelis and Jews abroad helping Israeli settlers buy houses outside of the Jewish quarter, as well as, the use of military intimidation of people who refuse to sell, thus displacing Palestinian citizens. Similarly, to the rest of East Jerusalem, the increase in number of settlers in the Old City has led to an increase in violence against Palestinians.

The above ground demographics are not the only thing the Israelis are trying to change. Since 1967, the Israeli government has funded explorations under the ground of the Old City, specifically around the Western Wall and under the Muslim Quarter. Over 1.5 million tourists visit the tunnels that resulted from these explorations each year. The tours given to these tourists are very carefully crafted to show what is called the "Jewish history" of the Old City and justify the Jewish claims on Al-Haram al-Sharif. Furthermore, at times some facts are outright incorrect.

Access to Al Aqsa, the third holiest site in Islam, has also created a growing tension between Israelis and Palestinians in the Old City, and Jerusalem more broadly. In recent years, the number of illegal invasions of Al Aqsa by Israelis has increased significantly.







October 2015 Uprising and Beyond

Between October 2015-December 18, 2015, 128 Palestinians have been killed, and thousands injured. During the same period of time, 22 Israelis have been killed.

The explanations behind this increase in violence are varied. The most common explanation is that the violence is in response to illegal Israeli invasions of Al Aqsa. With the rising number of Israelis illegally entering Al Aqsa, tensions have been mounting for a while. When the tension finally broke and Palestinians began protesting the Israelis' illegal actions, the IOF was quick to respond with disproportionate force. The IOF almost immediately clamped down on Palestinians both in the Old City and East Jerusalem, more broadly with increased arrests, flying checkpoints, and random stops and frisks.

However, the increased level of violence that began in October cannot be viewed under a microscope. Instead, it is important to recognize that the tensions here have been growing since the first day of the occupation. To list every incident that has added tinder to the fire that is growing here would be impossible. However, two of the most remembered events happened during the summers of 2014 and 2015. First, in 2014 before the Gaza assault began, a 13-year-old East Jerusalem boy, named Mohammed Abu Khdeir, was burned alive. Second, during the summer of 2015, a Palestinian family was burned alive by Israeli settlersas they slept in their home. These events just added to the many abuses suffered by Palestinians every day. Thus, to ignore these events, as well as the rest of the occupation, when analyzing the current uprising, would be naïve.

Since the beginning of October, arrests all over the West Bank have risen exponentially, with an average of 78 search



and arrest raids each week, and a record breaking 84 arrests happening in one night³². Worse, still according to Defense for Children International, the IOF has arrested 350 children since the beginning of October 2015 alone³³. Adding further pressure to the situation, 514 people have been displaced, and 450 structures have been demolished in East Jerusalem alone³⁴.

Stated simply, this situation is not tenable. Each year that the occupation goes on, pressure builds, evidenced by the ever-increasing number of violent outbursts.

After 67 years of occupation, the international community should practice more pressure on Israel to end its apartheid policies and occupation of the Palestinian land.

It is crucial to understand that the current deterioration of the security situation and escalation of violence is taking place in the context of Israel's prolonged military occupation of Palestinian territory, chronic violations of Palestinian human rights, the lack of a political process, and the lack of accountability for violations of international law. In the West Bank, continued settlement activity, settler attacks, and the lack of law enforcement by the Israeli authorities further underpin the deterioration. In Gaza, unrest and frustration must be seen in the context of a tight blockade imposed by Israel since 2007, crippling the economy and pushing a large part of the population


