


\* West Bank - Tulkarem - project locations

## **Component 1**

This component focuses on reducing vulnerability and improving food security at the household and community level in ten villages in Tulkarem and Khan Younis. The main activities of this component are land rehabilitation, greenhouses, seasonal crops, cisterns and ponds, and animal husbandry units.

# **Increasing Production in Local Communities**


## **GAZA STRIP**


ncreasing farmers' production of staple crops such as cucumbers and tomatoes in the Gaza Strip has increased the volume and diversity of food available in three districts. The Gaza population is directly benefitting from increased agricultural production through diversification and improved availability of food, reduced prices and increased incomes for farmers.

AMENCA2 tomato production contributed **7%** of the entire tomato production in the Gaza Strip (Year 4 est.)


The rehabilitation of 404 commercial greenhouses alone is estimated to have added an additional 1,484 tons of food to the annual food production of the Gaza Strip, with an estimated net value of AU\$1,815,175.

Mr. Manar Abu Mutlaq from Abasan Village stands in his rehabilitated commercial-scale greenhouse planted with tomatoes in Khuza'a in the Gaza Strip. To make an impact on food security and incomes in the Gaza Strip, the project supports large greenhouses, which increase the availability of food in the context of the economic blockade.





The project supports farmers to increase their productivity and improve access to fresh food at the community level in Gaza.





Farmers increased their food production by almost 400 per cent between baseline surveys to Year 3.

# III: Kur Village Reservoir Rehabilitation

Rainwater collection capacity enhanced for 300 people living in Kur.

- $-4500 \text{m}^3 \, \text{of rainwater harvesting} \\$  annually.
- Cost of irrigation water decreased by more than 75%

# IV: Water Ponds

## Problem:

Unreliable access to water reduced the quality and quantity of food farmers were able to produce

## Intervention:

Construction of

200m<sup>3</sup>

storage capacity

#### Before the intervention:

"The timing of irrigation was unpredictable... sometimes my plants would wait days without water".

#### After the intervention:

"The pond has made us feel more secure, it made our work easier".

## **Water Control**

enhanced for 27 farmers through the construction of Kufr Jammal Pond.

## **Results:**

- Better management of irrigation timing and frequency.
- Improved quality of food produced.
- Decrease use of external water sources by 25%.
- Cost saving and increased income for farmers.

## Component 2

Capacity building is the second component of this project and focuses on enhancing the capacity of community-based organisations (CBOs) to actively serve their communities and enhance active participation of women in decision-making for the communities. There are three major activities within this component: grants, training workshops and civic debates.

This component focuses on empowering women and enhancing women's role and status within their communities.

"As a member in the club, I can better communicate with youth and encourage their talents," Maha Abu Zaida, a female member in the General Assembly of

Kufr Zeibad Club (a CBO benefiting from the program), explains. Maha is a teacher; she reports an improvement in communicating and empowering youth in her village through the membership of the club.

mproved psycho-social well-being of children and women in Gaza. This was a new component added to the project in 2013.

In early 2014, four playgrounds in the Gaza Strip were rehabilitated in:

- 1. Al-Bassah- central Gaza Strip
- 2. Al-Sadaga- Khan Younis, south Gaza Strip
- 3. Al-Eskan Al- Abyad- Rafah, far south Gaza Strip
- Al-Twam Amer project area, Jabalia, north Gaza Strip



In just two months, 3300 girls and 3000 boys, including 69 children with disabilities, participated in community-based organisations (CBO) outdoor activities in the playgrounds.

This component also supported CBOs to improve their abilities to deliver safe child-friendly services:

- 16 CBOs provided direct emergency interventions in their communities and built CBO capacities to deliver child-friendly best-practice PSS.
- 64 CBO staff (four per CBO) completed 25 hours of training in child rights and child protection, delivered by professional trainers in PSS support and child protection.



A'AN established the Beit Qad Permaculture Centre in 2013 with funding from AMENCA2 and additional support from the Kadoorie Charitable Foundation and the GEF Small Grants Program. The farm is built on four acres in the far north of the West Bank, and it produces food sustainably without chemical herbicides, pesticides or fertilisers. It also serves as a living learning centre for developing and demonstrating new and innovative strategies in sustainable farming, including water conservation, and for teaching these techniques to others.

The farm builds on the strengths of Palestinian farmers by modifying and improving farming methods already popular in the West Bank:

- Greenhouses
- Water ponds
- Apiculture


It also incorporates alternative methods from permaculture design:


